



# FOUR-CARD POKER

## RANKING OF HANDS FROM HIGHEST TO LOWEST:

- Four-of-a-Kind
- Straight Flush
- Three-of-a-Kind
- Flush
- Straight
- Two Pair
- Pair
- High Card

NOTE: If a hand does not contain a pair or better, the hand that contains the highest ranking card(s) wins. Ace is high except in 4-3-2-Ace sequence.

## PLAYING AGAINST THE DEALER-ANTE

When you place this bet, you're wagering your four-card hand will beat the dealer's four-card hand. If you decide your hand can beat the dealer's hand, you must make a second bet called the Play Bet. The Play Bet must be 1 to 3 times the Ante.

NOTE: The Player wins ties. Consider the entire four-card hand when declaring a tie.

Players must be seated and keep their cards in full view of the dealer at all times.

## PAYOUT ODDS

### PLAYER FOLDS

Player's hand beats or ties dealer's hand

### ANTE LOSES

Play wins 1 to 1

Ante wins 1 to 1

Dealer's hand beats player's hand

Play is a loss

Ante is a loss

Certain player hands receive an automatic bonus. These payouts are made against the Ante wager. Consult layout for odds. Automatic bonus payouts are always paid even if the player's hand loses.

## AUTOMATIC BONUS PAYOUT ODDS

25 to 1

Straight Flush

20 to 1

Three-of-a-Kind

2 to 1



# FOUR-CARD POKER (CONT.)

## PLAYING AGAINST THE TABLE - ACES UP

The object of betting the Aces Up wager is to receive a pair of Aces or better. If your hand contains a pair of Aces or better, you win the Aces Up wager. You receive Aces Up payouts regardless of the dealer's hand.

PLAYER'S HAND	PAYOFF
Four-of-a-Kind	50 to 1
Straight Flush	40 to 1
Three-of-a-Kind	8 to 1
Flush	6 to 1
Straight	4 to 1
Two Pair	2 to 1
Pair of Aces	1 to 1

## PLAYING BOTH - ACES UP AND ANTE

When you bet both the Aces Up and the Ante (including Play), you're playing against two separate pay tables with two different criteria for payouts. In playing the Ante wager, the object is to get a four-card poker hand that beats the dealer's best four-card hand. In playing the Aces Up wager, the object is to receive a pair of Aces or better. The Ante and Aces Up wagers do not have to be the same amount. You receive the wager anywhere from the minimum to the maximum allowed on either spot. However, the Play wager must be from 1 to 3 times the Ante.

Side bets between players are prohibited.



# FOUR-CARD POKER (CONT.)

## FOUR-CARD POKER PROGRESSIVE RULES OF PLAY

- Four-Card Poker Progressive is an optional progressive side bet.
- The bet considers the best hand possible among all 5 cards (progressive bet only) dealt to the player, not just the player's 4 card hand that is in play.
- The pay tables shown have been designed to work on the link with different games all linked together. These pay tables all define the 5 card winning hand from a standard 52 card deck.

### PAY TABLE

HAND	PAYS*	ENVY
Royal Flush	100%	\$1,000
Straight Flush	10%	\$300
Four-of-a-Kind	299 to 1	
Full House	49 to 1	
Flush	39 to 1	
Straight	29 to 1	
Three-of-a-Kind	8 to 1
